New Business:

Laura Deuso and Scot Broman were present to update the board on the site location and construction of the bandshell. Moved by Bullis, seconded by Jones to allow the Friends of Rib Lake to move forward with a site investigation for the bandshell project. Motion carried.

The Village received one bid for North Front Street from American Asphalt for \$77,076.62. Moved by Buksa, seconded by Bullis to approve the bid and asked Josh to set up a contractor to do the curb and gutter before the street is redone. Motion carried.

Josh Bernt was present to discuss purchasing a snow pusher for the Volvo at a cost of \$10,750. Moved by Bullis, seconded by Buksa to purchase the snow pusher from Swiderski Equipment. Motion carried.

Moved by Jones, seconded by Mann to authorize the closing of the following listed streets for the 2023 Ice Age Days celebrations from Aug. 11th at 4:00 p.m. until Aug. 14th at 8:00 a.m.: all of McComb Ave. and alley to the west, Landall from Pearl to Mill, part of Mill (from Landall to the True Value) and part of Railroad (3rd to Lake), Mill Lane from 102 to Railroad, 2nd St. from Railroad to Church (Saturday only) from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Motion carried.

Moved by Beckstrand, seconded by Tesch to waive the open container law for 2023 Ice Age Days celebration on the following streets and/or areas. Motion carried.

McComb Ave. from Fayette to STH 102

S. McComb Ave. from STH 102 to Railroad St. – Saturday and Sunday during hours of daylight only.

2nd St. from Railroad St. to Church St. – Saturday from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. if needed for the car show and from one hour prior to the parade to one hour after the parade on Sunday.

Railroad St. from 3rd St. to Lake Street – Saturday from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. if needed for the car show.

Landall Ave. from the alley between McComb and Pearl St. to Mill Lane.

Mill Ln. from STH 102 to Railroad St. from one hour prior to the mini-rod pulls until one hour after their completion.

Fayette Ave. from McComb to Tannery Creek Parkway during games and one hour after completion of the last game each day.

Open containers shall not be allowed on any other village streets or alleys. No alcohol or soda carry ins of any type will be allowed in any of the designated streets/areas.

Moved by Tesch, seconded by Jones to purchase additional security cameras for McComb Ave. at a cost of \$2323.94. Motion carried.

President Schreiner announced consideration of movement into closed session pursuant to Section 19.85 (1)(c) considering employment, promotion, compensation, or performance evaluation data of any public employee over which the governmental body has jurisdiction or exercises responsibility. Moved by Mann, seconded by Jones to go into closed session. A roll call vote was taken to go into closed session with all in favor. Motion carried.

Back into open session. No motions were made as a result of the closed session.

Streets – There will be a tree removed on Landall Ave.

Utilities – The Sewer Plant samples have been good.

Park, Lake, & Rec – The DNR will be here on July 19th to do some testing at Tannery Creek. The Park Shelter cement work has been completed. The Campground has been very busy.

Fire & Recycling – There is a meeting on July 27th.

Library – The Picnic Shelter ceiling will be done by the end of the month. The Library events at the Picnic Shelter have been well attended.

Police – The County has posted signs on Kennedy Street between the football field and the Elementary School driveway that there is to be no parking on either side of the street.
